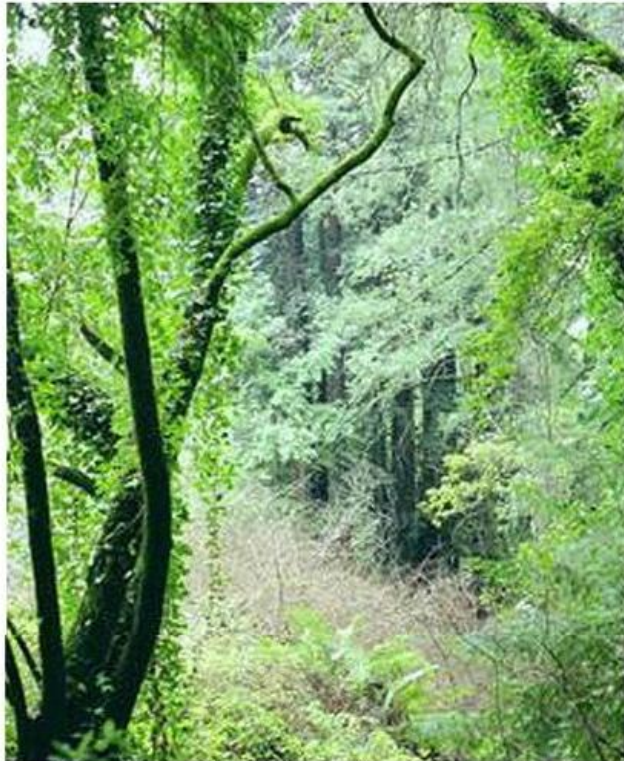


What “Uncle Lou” Would Have Wanted

Friends of Morningstar – An Affiliate of The Bodega Land Trust



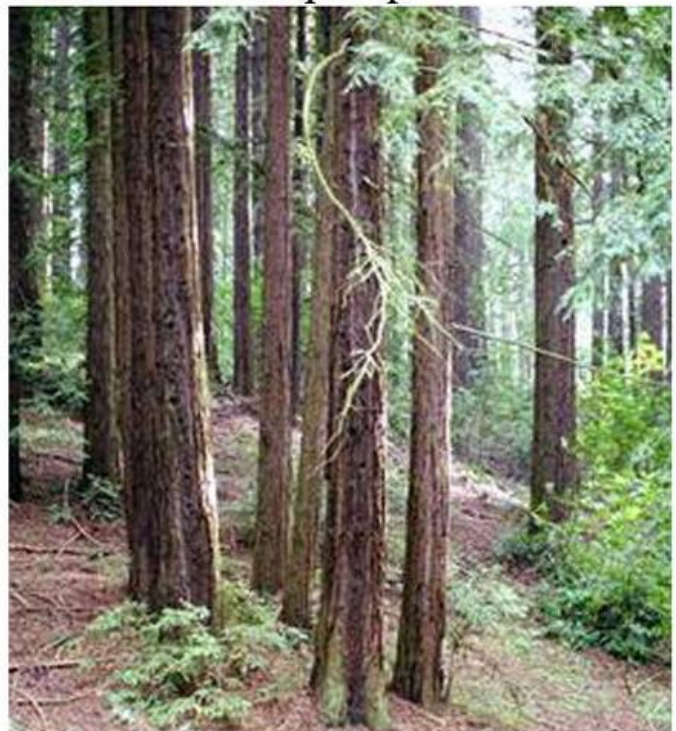
